The main objective of this webinar is to provide information on the open call for RadoNorm citizen science proposals and support potential applicants to apply. RadoNorm is looking to fund and support citizen science initiatives related to radon testing and/or radon mitigation in radon priority areas. RadoNorm will provide funding for a six-month project, alongside dedicated activities, resources and tools to set up and run the project. You will have the chance work together with RadoNorm researchers and professionals to tailor the support you need to achieve your goals.

A maximum contract of 25,000 € out of a total of 125,000 € is available for successful applicants to help them deliver a six-month project on radon measurement and/or mitigation. The funding can be spent on salaries, equipment, consumables, travel and indirect expenditure (calculated as 25% of the total direct costs) in accordance with Horizon 2020 guidelines.
